It is a great pleasure to share some events that have happened in the month of July. First of all, I want to congratulate all of you who have been voted into office by your peers. There is no greater honor than your peers asking you to be their leader. Good luck and have a great year. The Commander as you know has been involved in bringing training to the Legionnaires throughout the State. This is being accomplished with the support of Past Department Commanders and Department officers. It has been extremely successful and we are on track to have trained well over 350 legionnaires. The Boy State Program was also a great success. We had over 535 young men arrive to participate in the program and only one dropped out. This was the seventieth year of this program and it continues to be a great success. Without you, this program and others would not exist. Keep up the great work!

During the week of July 15, the VA&R staff is assisting veterans with benefits and claims during the 104th Annual Convention of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in Orlando, Florida.

I encourage all of you to visit our Department Website and tell us what you think. We are here to serve you and this can only be accomplished if you let us know what is important to you. We have two major areas that are always a concern:

1. Membership. You hear it every day and I know in your hearts you do what you can to make a difference. An easy way to find members is through your friends and family. They see that you are proud of your service to your country and they want to be a part of it too. Currently we have 1.6 million veterans in the State of Florida. This year, the Commander wants to jump out of a perfectly good airplane as an incentive for making the membership goal of 108%. He has asked me to jump at the goal of 110%. So this year I ask all members to keep this in mind as I'm requesting that each of you make 109.5% so I can wave to the Commander as he jumps.

It doesn't matter how small your community involvement is, what's really important is that you start somewhere. Your Department has plenty of giveaways and pamphlets to provide for these events. Some of you have heard me ask for help being a point of contact to your state Legislative Representatives and Senators. Many of you have stepped up to the plate. Although we are on the right path, we need more volunteers to speak to your officials, in your location, meet them one on one, at a luncheon or in their office. Get to know them, let them know about the American Legion, the real Legion, not their preconceived notion of the Legion being just a bar. I want your representative and senator to ask you your thoughts when they have a bill or a question about veterans. Where it is important to meet the officials, it's more important to KNOW the Legislative Director in the office. He/She will normally be the person you will be speaking with concerning pro and cons on issues. Keep in mind The American Legion is non-partisan, we are issue driven.

I don't expect you to make this a full time job. All I need is your name, phone #, the names of your representative and senator and which state district they are in. Just meet and greet; explain The American Legion and what we do. Praise them when they do good and let them know when it's not, WITH RESPECT. We will send out an e-mail to you when there is an issue. You will contact, in person or by phone, the office and speak to the Legislative Director. Explain our Legion thoughts on that issue. When you get an answer e-mail the information back to me and we will compile all that information. We will direct that issue to the appropriate chairman in Tallahassee. I don't care if there are 10 points of contact in one state district; the more the merrier! They will know WHO THE AMERICAN LEGION IS. I do want to cover our whole state, so I am asking not only the American Legion but the American Legion Auxiliary, the Son of The American Legion and The American Legion Riders, the family. After all, WE DO VOTE; our officials understand numbers.

When you speak to your representative or senator, please wear appropriate clothing, slacks, nice shirt with the assigned badge of your family and your cover. Be proud that you represent THE AMERICAN LEGION FAMILY. For God and Country

My thanks to Art Schwabe, Department Commander, For appointing me to another year as chairman. I am also National Vice Chairman of the National Legislative Commission. At the National Convention in Houston, our commission will go over loads of resolutions related to Legislation in which the best ones will be presented to all the delegates at the National convention for approval. Those approved will be given to our Legislative Division located in Washington, D.C. They in turn will write up point papers for our new National Commander to be used when he will give testimony on September 10th to the United States House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees. This year will be my 25th year that I will be at this hearing. After the Commander's testimony, the Legion delegates will visit their members of Congress and request their support to all the items mentioned in the Point papers. Florida delegates there will visit all 27 House members from Florida and our two Senators.

Some of the points to be discussed are: The Flag Amendment, FY 2014 VA appropriations, FY 2014 DoD appropriations and other Veterans Affairs items.

LEGISLATIVE DIVISION ACTIONS

Military Sexual Trauma Roundtable

On Thursday, July 18, American Legion legislative staff attended a round table discussion of VSOs regarding the issue of military sexual trauma (MST), and the way forward. Specifically discussed were proposed changes to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) with regard to how MST cases are handled: Sen. Kristen Gilibrand's (NY) proposed legislation entitle The Military Justice Improvement Act, Rep. Jackie Speier's (CA) STOP Act, Sen. Carl Levin's (NY) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), as well as various other similar amendments dealing with the issue of MST.

Sen. Gilibrand's legislation proposes to move disposition authority out of the chain of command, to a professional military prosecutor. Rep. Speier's legislation would create a Sexual Assault Oversight and Response Office (SAORO), and all prosecutorial responsibilities of sexual-related offenses committed by a member of the armed forces would be ceded to it. Sen. Levin's amendment, taking a more conservative approach, would allow commanders to retain disposition authority, but would require the review of a commander's decision by the next higher level of the chain of command in cases where the commander opts not to prosecute.

Update on Flag Amendment Bill

On May 22, House Joint Resolution (H.J. Res.) 47 was introduced by Rep. Spencer Bachus (AL). This legislation is a proposed constitutional amendment to protect the American flag from physical desecration. Its text states simply: "The Congress shall have power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States." The measure now has 17 cosponsors, with the addition Tuesday of Rep. Jim Jordan (OH).

On June 13, Sen. Orrin Hatch (UT) introduced Senate Joint Resolution (S.J. Res.) 17, a companion measure. This measure has 21 cosponsors.

DPMO – Defense POW/Missing Personnel Office

The Defense POW/Missing Personnel Office (DPMO) was established in 1993 to form a single office to oversee and manage POW/MIA issues. To learn more go to www.dtic.mil/dpmo

Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC)

JPAC is the 500 member operational unit of DPMO. JPAC is the "boots on the ground" organization. Their day-to-day operations involve investigating leads and recovering and identifying Americans who were killed in action but were never brought home. They also continue to search for POW's. In the first 6 months of this year the remains of 38 of our comrades were found and returned home. To learn more go to www.jpac.pacom.mil

This article is not about whom I am, or what I do, but rather the purpose of this writing is to promote the awareness and urgency of the American Legion Blood Donor Program. The Blood Donor Program is one of the least expensive, yet one of the most rewarding, urgently need community service programs your post could possibly support.

Every two seconds, someone in the United States needs blood, and each day blood donations to meet this life saving necessity comes up short. Eligible donors with type's O negative, B negative and A negative blood are especially encouraged to give. Type O negative is the universal blood type and can be transfused to anyone who needs blood. Types A negative and B negative can be transfused to Rh positive or negative patients.

There is also an urgent need for platelet donations. Platelets – a key clotting component of blood often needed by cancer patients - must be transfused within five days of donation, so it's important to have a steady supply of platelets on hand.

Your donated blood is divided into three blood products: red blood cells used to treat trauma and cancer victims, plasma used to treat burn victims, and platelets used primarily to treat cancer victims. Therefore, it is conceivable that every pint of blood you donate could save, or at least make lives more bearable, for up to 3 sick or injured individuals.

In most instances, your blood donation will save the life, or at least help someone you most likely will never know. On the other hand, heaven forbid, you or a member of your family may be in need of a lifesaving blood transfusion before this day is over.

In a worst case scenario, you or one of your loved ones may be rushed to the hospital only to hear a physician say they must forego performing a lifesaving surgical procedure because of a shortage of blood. So hear me folks! We need to do everything we can to make sure it does not get to that point.

Also, think about our young wounded warriors returning from war with serious wounds and unimaginable burns. These young warriors need many pints of blood and blood products every day to give them a chance to recuperate and to survive. And fellow legion members, all of this blood that is so desperately needed today can come ONLY from someone like you. Blood cannot be artificially manufactured.

Throughout the past, the Department of Florida has encouraged and assisted Posts throughout the state to actively promote the Blood Donor Program, and it will be that way again this year. As the Department Blood Donor Chairman, I will promote and provide any help possible to make the program a great success this coming year. And, folks, there is plenty of room for improvement.

For instance, according to Department records, out of 290 Post in the state of Florida, only 75 had a blood donor chairman this past year. Of the 75 Posts with Blood donor chairman, there were 175 blood drives netting 2389 pints of blood. Our heartfelt thanks to the posts that had blood drives, and to those individuals who understand the significance of making a lifesaving blood donation. However, considering that the Department of Florida American Legion Family (Legion, Auxiliary, Sons) consists of more than 160,000 members at 290 posts throughout the state, surely, folks, I know you can, and hope you will improve on last year's record considerably.

Make a sincere effort to recruit a blood donor chairman for your post, and encourage your membership to participate in regularly scheduled blood drives. Any blood bank in your area will be more than happy to assist you in setting up a blood donor account and scheduling blood drives for your post.

Only about 5% of the people eligible to donate blood actually donate on a regular basis. In regards that, I ask this question: are you going to just sit back and be one of the 95% who will turn your head and walk away unwilling to make a blood donation to save a life, or are you going to be a hero and join the 5% who unselfishly donate blood on a regular basis. Remember the life you save could yours or one of your loved ones, or to save the life of a child suffering with leukemia, or to help our wounded warriors to heal and return to a normal life.




The American Legion Riders (ALR) is the fastest growing program in the American Legion. The American Legion Riders signature fund raiser is the Legacy Fund, which is designed to give scholarships to children of our military families who have lost the lives in service to our country. 



Meaning of the Preamble to The American Legion Constitution

For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes ... The American Legion recognizes the influence of Almighty God in all worthwhile endeavors and declares the allegiance of Legionnaires to both God and nation.

To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America

The Constitution of the United States is the written bulwark of our free way of life and representative government. It is our guarantee of liberty, freedom, justice and democracy. Members of The American Legion bore arms and went to war to defend and uphold this document of freedom.

To maintain law and order

Without law and order, liberty would become license. Law and order protect our pursuit of happiness, one of our God---given rights. Members of The American Legion served in wars to uphold law and order among nations. It is just as important to maintain the due processes of law in our domestic affairs. It binds Legionnaires to obey the laws of the land and to support the constituted authorities in enforcing those laws.

To foster and perpetuate a 100 percent Americanism

Americanism is the gist of the American ideals of freedom, justice, individual rights and unlimited opportunities. It embraces all the freedoms we cherish and all the rights that are guaranteed to us. It is the very opposite of hatred, bigotry and intolerance. Americanism is the creed that has blazed the world---wide trail for justice, fair play, decency, belief in God, private enterprise, universal education, and progress in all human endeavors. It puts a premium on the virtues of loyalty, patriotism, hard work and thrift.

To preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the great wars

Service in defense of America is the greatest experience in the lifetimes of all veterans. Recalling the highlights of that service means more than flashbacks to tense moments of excitement and danger in battle: the grime of muddy trenches, the perils of sub---infested oceans and the combat in the wild blue yonder. It means also the inerasable recollection of the comradeships, the bravery of pals, the team work, the sacrifices, the miseries and hardships of military campaigns shared in common. It means the bond that binds all ex---servicemen and women together in mutual affection, respect and gratitude. It also means keeping green forever the memories of the supreme sacrifices of gallant American patriots, sacrifices necessary to the winnings of wars. It means faithful annual observance of Memorial Day and Veterans Day.

To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation

Always interested in building a better nation, the founders of The American Legion believed that such building must start first with the individual in their own community. So they made it one of the cardinal principles of The American Legion to inculcate that sense of personal obligation to the community, state and nation into the individual citizen. That means educating the citizen – young, old and future – in his and her responsibility to be active in making the hometown a better place in which to live, in discharging the duty of voting in elections, in paying taxes promptly, in contributing to community chest funds and to blood banks. The word “inculcate” means “to impress by frequent admonitions” and “to enforce by frequent repetitions.” Like the duties themselves, the reminders that they remain to be carried forward are never finished.

To combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses

This clause places the Legionnaire on the side of right in opposing autocracy by either class or mass when this threatens. In a democracy such as ours, composed as it is of all nationalities, races, creeds and economic groups, there are bound to be both classes and masses. Indeed, the masses are composed of classes – but all groups within the mass must feel assured that in this nation, reason and fairness will prevail in all human activities and relations.

To make right the master of might

Many wars have been started by dictators who wanted their might to be the right. If human freedom is not to perish from the earth, right must always be master of might. The rights of small nations must be protected against the tyranny that powerful neighbors may seek to impose on them, just as the rights of minorities in our society must be protected and respected. Legionnaires are pledged by this clause always to stand with the right, protect the weak and preserve the liberties of the individual. This concept is the basis of The American Legion's continued advocacy of a strong national preparedness so as to achieve the ideal situation that right will be backed by adequate might.

To promote peace and good will on earth

Until the entire world becomes a good neighborhood, Legionnaires must continue the effort to promote peace and good will on earth. It is in pursuance of this founding ideal that The American Legion has supported from the beginning and seeks to strengthen the United Nations organization. Obliquely, The American Legion also contributes to this ideal by firmly supporting a strong national defense to discourage breaking of the peace by aggressors.

To safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy

On this ideal of safeguarding and transmitting the principles of justice, freedom and democracy, all of the youth--- training programs of The American Legion are built. All Americans can be proud that in our international relations we have tried to live by the golden rule, the mark of justice. We have granted to others, as we prize it ourselves, the great boon of freedom. Through the Monroe Doctrine, we called a halt to foreign imperialism in the western hemisphere. We gave freedom to the Philippines. These principles are part of the American heritage. Legionnaires are pledged to protect and preserve that heritage.

To consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness This is the most important ideal expressed in our preamble. We can hail The American Legion today as an unparalleled force in these United States for social betterment. American Legion concepts and its ideal of devotion to mutual helpfulness warmed the entire social climate of America. Today America is extending its helpful hands all over the world through our assistance programs of foreign aid. This all came about because the veterans of World War I came home enriched with wonderful ties of friendship and gave those ties meaning by consecrating them to the ideal of mutual helpfulness.
