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



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
Dear Legionnaires, and Scouters,

I am real excited that plans for the 2nd Annual , American Legion, Department Of Florida ,Boy Scout Cracker Trail Competition is well under way and shaping up to greatly exceed the attendance of the 2012 event. We are receiving a lot of feedback from the Troops, Ship, Crews, from last year and receiving inquiries of their reservations for this year. Please allow me to share one of the many quotes received on our check out survey, "This was the best Boy Scout camping event that we have attended in the last 10 years"

We have a goal this year to expand from about 25 Patrols, to at least a 10-15% , which is a strong reality, since many attending the 2012 Skills Adventure, have been talking it up , not only in Gulf Stream Council, but in Northern Florida, as well, as in Miami-Dade, and are anxiously waiting for February 8-10, 2013 to arrive, to come back to Tanah-Keeta, and , or, a proposed Northern Florida event, which is developing.

The real goal for this event is obviously to rebuild the relationship between the American Legion, and the Boy Scouts Of America, which has existed since 1919, and to encourage youth and their families to get involved in both programs, since our interests are the same in many ways, so, we have opened this event up to any Troop, Crew, or Ship; the only requirement being that Troops, etc. must obtain the signature of a (neighborhood?) Post Commander (Post locator-www.floridalegion.org, and Troop locator, www.beascout.org, by zip code in right hand, top section), also located on the attached , Cracker Trail flyer. We hope that this will start a new relationship, developing in such possible areas as Honor Guard, ceremonies, Eagle Projects, Citizenship Badges, etc.

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More on the Postal Issue... While I was at National Executive Committee meeting I was able to talk to the National Economic Commission concerning support of Federal Legislation that protects the employment of veterans in the U.S. Postal Service mail processing facilities that are slated for closure. The resolution was approved on May 9th during our Washington D.C. meeting in March. PDC Paul Martel and I were able to meet with my post member Senator Bill Nelson. We discussed problems of returning veterans trying to find jobs. He asked us many questions. This month he sponsored legislation S. 2130 to create a Veterans Conservation Corps to employ veterans and provide transitional opportunities through a range of projects that leverage skills developed in the military. The **Veterans Conservation Corps Authorization Act** will put veterans back to work doing conservation projects on federal lands and waters.

Veterans Skills to Jobs Act

Many veterans with specialized find that when they leave the service states, federal agencies do not recognize the training they received in the military. Many are required to go through duplicative training and certification for jobs they trained for and executed while in the military. This prevents veterans from quickly integrating into the workforce after separation from the Armed Forces. To help these veterans, Senator Nelson introduced the Veterans Skills to Jobs act of 2012, S. 2239, which requires Federal Agencies to recognize the relevant military training and skills when certifying veterans for Federal licenses.



ROTC/SHOOTING SPORTS

We have come to the end of the Legion Year and ROTC/Shooting Sports has been on a steady rise in participation. The final Cadet of the Year had an outstanding response with 81 applications. This has far exceeded previous year's response. I can only hope that the posts participation for the Year End Metal Awards has the same response. Most of the schools have completed their Military Balls and Award Ceremonies. I personally have attended as many as time would allow along with several ROTC Formal Inspections.

I would like to give congratulations to Charles W. Flanagan NJROTC Unit who were crowned the 2012 NJROTC National Champions and have brought honor to the state of Florida for the second year in a row. They outlasted 24 other units to capture the 2012 Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (NJROTC) National Academic, Athletic and Drill Championship in Pensacola April 13-14. The 25 NJROTC units, representing 15 states from coast to coast, were challenged on their athleticism, tested in academics and evaluated on the drill deck during competition held at the Naval Air Technical Training Center's (NATTC) Chevalier Hall and on the Naval Air Station (NAS) Pensacola Track and Parade Field.

"The cadets worked very hard to get here, not just undergoing the extra practices in drill and athletics to prepare, but extra studying for the academics as well," said Lt. Cmdr. Jim Stauffer, senior naval science instructor for Flanagan High School, located in Pembroke Pines, Fla. The personnel inspections, color guard and most drill competitions were judged by Navy Recruit Division commanders and Marine Corps drill instructors from Officer Training Command, Newport, R.I. In addition, Marines from Marine Aviation Training Support Group-21 assisted in judging the armed rifle exhibition, while Sailors from the Navy Recruiting Orientation Unit at NAS Pensacola judged the curl-up and push-up portions of the competition.

While Flanagan High School finished first, four of last year's top five units returned to the top this year. Boca Raton (Fla.) High School, last year's champion, finished second followed by Centennial (Las Vegas) High School. Approximately 25 of more than 600 NJROTC units qualify for the national competition annually.

Flanagan's NJROTC program was started in 2001 and Naval Science Instructor, Senior Chief Petty Officer Wayne Smith, was there to open the doors and just last year was named Flanagan High School Teacher of the Year. "The unit held fundraisers throughout the year to fund this trip," Stauffer said. "Most of the financial burden falls on the backs of the parents as our annual expenses exceed \$40,000. We are always looking for creative ways to keep the coffers from running dry. The parents, school and community really supported and got behind these kids."

I want to thank everyone for their hard work this year and look forward to serving the Department of Florida next year as our programs continues to increase. Thank you all and have a good summer. For God and Country
