

The Legionnaire Insurance Trust Holds Its 49th Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors CHICAGO, Illinois (May 2, 2014) - The Board of Directors of the Legionnaire Insurance Trust (LIT) held their forty-ninth annual meeting on April 15, 2014 in Scottsdale, Arizona. Forty-seven of the forty-nine participating Departments – state organizations of The American Legion – were represented at the meeting.

Since its inception in 1966, the LIT has returned around one billion dollars in benefits to insured Legion families and over \$71,000,000 to the participating Departments for their use in areas such as veterans' affairs & rehabilitation.

This year, the Board met to receive the financial report for the past year, and to distribute nearly \$2.5 million to participating departments. The report outlined both the 2013 activities and 2014 plans on behalf of the Trust and introduced the proposed changes and additions to the Trust's portfolio of products. Additionally, Board officers were elected for the coming year. The Board Meeting also included a new award presented by the agent/administrator – AGIA Affinity Services – the John J. "Jack" Flynn Trophy to honor the Department that excelled in promoting the programs and services of the Legionnaire Insurance Trust in the prior year. Jack Flynn was the founding Chairman of the LIT and served in that capacity until his passing in February 2013. The 2013 winner of the Jack Flynn Trophy was the Department of Iowa. Iowa will hold the Trophy until the April 2015 Board Meeting.

## Stanley Gold, Department National Legislative Chairman

Last November at the Fall Meeting in Orlando. Our Department asked me to 'help another group of veterans in securing support for House bill 1726 introduced by Florida Congressman Bill Posey. The bill requests the Congressional Gold Medal for veterans of the 65th Infantry Regiment (known as the Boringueneers). Originally based in Puerto Rico for their distinguished service during the Korean War. A companion bill was also introduced in the Senate. Within a week after the Department made calls all 27 members of Congress from Florida were co-sponsors plus our two Senators. Coral Gables Post 98 passed a resolution to have The American Legion support this cause. Last week with good help from other departments, two-thirds of the House and Senate co-sponsored these two bills were voted on by the full House and Senate and passed. Now it goes to the President for signing.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> I was assigned by the Department to go to Senator Marco Rubio's officer in Miami for a press interview along with four other groups. We met with the Senator and answered questions concerning the problems at the VA hospitals. We all gave them our input.

The Senator stated the House passed the VA Accountability Bill introduced by our Florida congressman Jeff Miller. This bill gives the right for the VA Secretary to fire or demote career VA employees involved in cases of negligence or mismanagement. Now the Senate will vote on a similar bill introduced by Senator Rubio. He state, "this bill, if passed, will highlight the need to bring real accountability to the VA.

From problems in Phoenix, AZ to Miami, FL and now potentially Gainesville too, we've seen plenty finger pointing and excuses but no one actually being fired for incompetence and negligence in the performance of their duties." He also mentioned that Bill Nelson was a supporter of this bill.

# CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION Clarence Hill Past National Commander

Long-time Legionnaires will remember Bob Francis. One of our most productive members in Florida history, Bob noted in 1959 that there was no history of Florida on file anywhere and set out to remedy that situation. He eventually compiled "A History of The American Legion-Department of Florida—1919-1960." Most of the Florida Founding Fathers were deceased, but he was able to put a couple of pages together. And of course, there are two versions depending on which Founding Father you believe. I will provide more on that in later articles. Bob quoted the following information from an author unknown letter written May28, 1958, to Department Adjutant Ernest Rowton: "For the historical record of The American Legion, Department of Florida, these are the facts concerning the founding of The American Legion, Department of Florida. The American Legion, Department of Florida, was founded on a Pullman Car between St. Louis, Missouri, and Jacksonville, Florida, on May 10, 1919."

The American Legion will hold a 15 month commemoration of 100 years of service to veterans, military personnel, families and communities starting at the National Convention in 2018, continuing throughout 2019, continuing through the National Convention in 2019 and culminating on Veterans Day 2019. The Department of Florida will form a Centennial Celebration Observance Committee to develop a plan for events at the Department level. PNC Clarence Hill will serve as chairman of the committee and each District should appoint one member to serve on the committee. When selecting a representative, District Commanders should consider someone interested in history and willing to serve through the celebration. The goal is to have a committee established and hold a meeting at the 2015 Department Convention. Anyone else desiring to be on the committee should volunteer by email to cehill316@aol.com.

Posts should form their own centennial committees and plan events around significant events in their history. Each Post can convey its legacy by sharing historical photos, videos and print material on the Legion's new Centennial Celebration web page: www.legion.org/ centennial. Detailed instructions on how to create a Post history page is available on the web page, as are the types of information a Post should look to identify for their centennial. For more information on the National web page, email ledwards@legion.org. Department HQ has copies of the Centennial Celebration Workbook that gives step-by-step procedures on creating and posting your history, and the Legacy Vision which is an overall guide to the process. Department has little in the way of early history, but from the 1950's on, there are issues of the Florida Legionnaire and Legion Link that can be consulted.
