This year the annual District Constitutional Conferences (DCC) begin on May 6th and end June 11th. The DCC is a time when delegates from Posts in the District come together to select delegates and alternates to the annual National Convention, elect District Officers for the next year, and hear campaign speeches from the candidates for Department Offices. Not all meeting halls are the same, District traditions vary, so these are JUST TIPS to help you have an orderly DCC.

This year you can expect up to as many as 10 candidates for Department Offices that may travel to your DCC and ask to speak. These candidates make one or two DCCs in a weekend, sometimes two in a day, depending on scheduling, so time is precious to them. It is good to get their speeches done early in your DCC so they can "hit the road" to their next stop and your District can then carry-on with business.

1. Have a separate sign in sheet for Department level candidates and other visiting Department officers and dignitaries. This separate list will help your District Commander with introductions. The Sgt.-at-Arms should always make sure their Commander is aware of who is in the hall among guests and dignitaries. Remember to keep introductions by District, by Department, in the chain of command sequence always ending with the appropriate Commander. If NEC or NEC/A are present they are introduced immediately before the Department Commander.
2. At some point, Department Commander Joe Magee will be asked by the District Commander to address the DCC to deliver his annual report or present awards. The Commander's presentation should come before Department Candidate Call.
3. If you can, try to seat the Department candidates together. The closer they are to the podium, the shorter wait you have for them to get up there and finish speaking. The candidates will often voluntarily line up in speaking order for you to help move the process along.
4. Remember the order of introductions of department candidate call usually goes in the same order as department level elections; Sgt.-at-Arms Candidate, Historian, Chaplain, 3rd Vice, 2nd Vice, 1st Vice, Commander.
5. When candidate's call is concluded, a Department Officer may request that the District Commander dismiss the group of candidates so they can report to the next DCC, or if not rushed they may decide to stay for the remainder of your DCC.

Once again, these are all tips, every meeting hall is different and some DCCs may have traditions that I may not be aware of. Good luck and have a great DCC!

The range of membership years for those attending FALC was 32 years to 1 year, with the 'mean' of membership for the group at about 8 years. We also had a member of the Sons of The American Legion, Greg Trammel, Squadron 402, complete the FALC and we congratulate him for this accomplishment!

The 27 class participants were divided into five imaginary 'districts' and during classes they had some great discussions about many programs of the national and department organizations, and worked in their 'district' on assigned projects. One of those projects was to write a 'Resolution' which is the written format by which The American Legion accepts new ideas to develop or improve programs, to stay current with society in general,

and to improve the support we provide to our troops and veterans. Each district was required to write and present a Resolution at the end of the class. Included among the Resolutions the class wrote were: (1) The American Legion form a new program, as it did to create the Sons of The American Legion, to create a "Non-Veteran Male Spouse" program that would provide membership to male spouses of female veterans; (2) The American Legion promote a National American Veteran Suicide Prevention Day; and (3) The American Legion establish a new program titled "Family Whole Person Support Program," to address the increasing needs for veterans and their families such as suicide, divorce, and substance abuse.

The class also was asked to design an FALC emblem and to select a standard color for the FALC graduate polo shirt. They submitted a total of 9 emblem designs, and an emblem and shirt color will be selected by the FALC Committee.

So, in closing this article allow me to use the format of the resolution writing process

WHEREAS, Twenty seven participants assembled February 16-18, 2017, at the Department of Florida successfully completed the Florida American Legion College Class of 2017; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the FALC Committee and the Department of Florida express appreciation to all participants, instructors, and department staff who contributed to the success of the training; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the FALC Class of 2017 express their appreciation to American Legion families at American Legion Posts 19 and 183 who welcomed and provided hospitality to the class; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That the dates for the next Florida American Legion College Class have been established as September 7-9, 2017.

The American Legion School Medal is the highest honor awarded presented to Youth by the American Legion. It is a medal that proclaims they are

kind of boy/girl that we believe worthy of such an honor. This is a good time to start ordering your medals and/or certificates so you will have them on hand in time for presentations in May/June. I have checked with National Emblem Sales and there are plenty in stock. You can order the medal only (item #717.200) or the medal and certificate (item #717.200C) for just 8.95 each. If you want to present just a certificate, they are only \$1.00 each or \$.70 when ordering in a batch of 100.

Hopefully by now your Post Commander has identified an ambassador of the American Legion to be the liaison with your local schools and if not, now is the time for someone from your Post to contact your local school's administration and inform them of this opportunity to recognize students at the end of the school year. It is recommended that Post Commanders appoint a committee of not more than three members to contact local school administrations. When this has been done, it will be possible to run a coordinated program with the school and Legion to ensure quality candidates are awarded at the end of the year. It is very important to begin this interaction started because the school year will be coming to an end soon.

In working with school administrators, it is important to explain the details on how the recipients are to be selected and why selections should be made well in advance of the elections. Members of the graduating class and the faculty are to cast secret ballots to determine the boy awardee and the girl awardee. Traits underlying the selection of the boy and the girl will be Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship and Service. Ensure that the voters understand the meaning of the qualities and their weights in the selection. The sole purpose of this undertaking by The American Legion is the cultivation of high character and wholesome ideals in youth approaching active citizenship. No trace of politics, sectarianism or favoritism should be allowed to attach itself to the School Award Program. Awards shall be made to the boy and to the girl of the graduating class in elementary, high schools and colleges.

The American Legion is an organization dedicated to the service of God and Country. We believe that one of the best ways to perform this service is to take an active interest in the preparation of our youth so that they will carry on the tradition of patriotism and become freedom-preserving citizens. It is in this interest that The American Legion School Awards Plan was born and is maintained on a National level through The Americanism Commission of the American Legion. With so many changes in our communities and their lack of supporting our shared values of duty, honor, and commitment to God and country, it is very important to recognize our youth who are guided by the highest ideals and on the right path.

There has been a rash of burglaries at American Legion Posts and VFW posts from Pasco County through Sumter County. These events have been happening after hours and the perpetrators have gained access through multiple means. Some events have even had their alarm systems disconnected and entire safes have been removed.

If your Post is not protected by an ACTIVE alarm system, now is the time to have one installed. If you have the little battery operated door or window monitors this is not enough to protect your Post. An active system is one that is professionally installed and connected to a monitoring site. Once a system has been triggered the monitoring station will call the Post and ask for a password. If the phone is not answered or the incorrect password is given the police will be at your Post within minutes. This protection is well worth the expense when you tally up the costs of repairs to your building and the loss of funds that will need to be replaced if your Post is hit.

There are other measures that need to be employed along with an active system. Never leave any cash behind your bar. Keep all monies under double lock and key. If your safe is portable, anchor it to the concrete slab or heavy beams under the floor system in your building. Make deposits as soon as possible so to limit the amount of cash on hand.

If you would like for me to personally visit your Post and assist you in assessing your security needs, just contact me and I will make arrangements to come to your Post and assist you.

Most veterans do not understand that there are different types of Compensation and here they are:

Types of Compensation

VA disability compensation provides monthly benefits to Veterans in recognition of the effects of disabilities, diseases, or injuries incurred or aggravated during active military service. The program also provides monthly payments to surviving spouses, dependent children, and dependent parents in recognition of the economic loss caused by a Veteran's death during military service or, after discharge from military service, as a result of a service-connected disability. A summary of VA's disability compensation programs is below.

Disability Compensation

A tax-free monetary benefit paid to Veterans with disabilities that are the result of a disease or injury incurred or aggravated during active military service. The benefit amount is graduated according to the degree of the Veteran's disability on a scale from 10 percent to 100 percent (in increments of 10 percent). Compensation may also be paid for disabilities that are considered related or secondary to disabilities occurring in service and for disabilities presumed to be related to circumstances of military service, even though they may arise after service. Generally, the degrees of disability specified are also designed to compensate for considerable loss of working time from exacerbations or illnesses.

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

DIC is a tax-free monetary benefit generally payable to a surviving spouse, child, or parent of Service members who died while on active duty, active duty for training, or inactive duty training, or to survivors of Veterans who died from their service-connected disabilities. Parents DIC is an income-based benefit for parents who were financially dependent on of a Service member or Veteran who died from a service-related cause.

Special Monthly Compensation (SMC)

SMC is an additional tax-free benefit that can be paid to Veterans, their spouses, surviving spouses and parents. For Veterans, Special Monthly Compensation is a higher rate of compensation paid due to special circumstances such as the need of aid and attendance by another person or by specific disability, such as loss of use of one hand or leg. For spouses and surviving spouses, this benefit is commonly referred to as aid and attendance and is paid based on the need of aid and attendance by another person.

Claims Based on Special Circumstances

Veterans may be eligible for other types of disability compensation once a disability has been determined to be service connected. Special VA disability compensation programs include: individual unemployability, automobile allowance, clothing allowance, pre-stabilization, hospitalization, convalescence, dental, and birth defects.


