# JSSP Registration in Progress Loretta Young, JRTOC / JSSP

I would like to emphasize that the JSSP Postal Target Orders are well underway. The deadline for registration is Dec. 14th. The time quickly passes, and I cannot stress enough how important it is to

get to your schools or teams that have a marksmanship program to register early. The deadline to register is Dec. 14th. Registration and payment are made online through the Department or National website with a credit card.

The Legion Post Commander/Officer must see the document receipt/certificate for the background check and Protect Youth Sports training prior to signing the Post Affiliation Form. Since this part of the registration takes a little time, it's important to ensure that your sponsored team has this step completed before you sign the form. I have had several individuals contact me regarding Legion Posts, which have a marksmanship program at the post. Although I have had several posts contact me regarding a startup program, I have not had anyone advise that they have already started their program. The startup and operation of a marksmanship program is on the Department website and is a great guide to putting one in place. As a backup to any request regarding current programs, I refer to the Civilian Marksmanship Program website as an excellent source to find active youth clubs that offer Air Rifle Programs.

I hope the posts are in touch with your JROTC Units and will be sharing some time at their Raider, Color Guard, Drill Events, or any other after-school or weekend programs. They are also an excellent partnership for next month's upcoming Veteran's Day Programs or assisting your veterans at the posts or your events. Thanks so much for your support of our Youth Programs, and please share any photos of events that you may be having in your communities.

Happy New Year, everyone! I pray that the 2023 year brings you Happiness and Joy! As we settle down from all the holiday festivities, let's focus on the Goals of 2023 for the Legislature, that is, passing bills and,

most importantly, the State Budget.

Things to remember about our Legislature process: we have already had a committee week in preparation for the 2023 season and a special session. Future committee weeks are as follows: 1/3 - 1/6; 1/17 - 1/20; 1/23 - 1/27; 2/6 - 2/10; 2/13 - 2/17; 2/20 - 2/24. Then

the session will begin on 3/7 and last for 60 days.

What to expect from committee weeks – this is when bills are filed, and information is provided to aid the legislators in determining whether they should back the bill or not. It allows the subject matter experts to provide testimony so that it is better understood and the reasoning behind the filing of the bill. This is also the time for last-minute bill filings. Last year over three thousand bills were filed, and less than 300 were passed. So, it is important to pay attention to the weekly updates that will begin on March 13th. These weekly updates will let you know what the position is on each of the bills filed that we are tracking. These positions are based on bill analysis and if it will benefit our veteran community.

When you get these updates and wish to reach out to your local legislator, please keep it professional and concise. For example – if you are reaching out via email – introduce yourself and what post you are from. This lets them know you are a vote in their district. Then inform them about The American Legion and what we do for our veterans and community. Lastly, let them know the stance you and your post take on the matter. The stance can be brought up during your meetings at the post.

Keep an eye out for the date for March on Tallahassee, where we assemble to meet our legislators.

We have successfully survived 2022, one of the busiest years this decade. Hurricanes, Major Elections, inflation, and the Holidays. All of these have affected our membership. It is now time to try and recover while helping those

who are in need. As our National Vice Commander Harris stated, it's time for us all to BE-THE-ONE.

Revitalization is a priority. Each District should hold at least two revitalizations a membership year and share your results so we all benefit from lessons learned. In those areas needing assistance, contact our Department Revitalization Chair, who can assist in getting Department and National Assistance.

PDC Ramos once said: As the American Legion continues its drive to protect

and preserve veteran benefit programs -especially in the area of medical care—the numerical strength of the organization is very important. Make sure your Post is doing its part in the nationwide drive to increase the Legion's position of power. This still holds true today as it did 10 years ago.

CPRs are now online. The Consolidated Post Report was established in 1975 in order to assist departments in the documentation of the various activities a specific post has done during the twelve-month reporting period from June 1 through May 31. The Consolidated Post Report (CPR) may be the most important document your post will complete this year. Your post's information, combined with other posts, is used when the National Commander and others testify on Capitol Hill on behalf of all veterans. Each post has a story to tell, and when we speak collectively, our strength is magnified. The Post Adjutant, through myLegion.org, can begin filling it out immediately so they can submit it in May.

Mentorship is when an individual with perspective and experience (the mentor)

instructs and guides another person with less experience (the mentee). The mentoring relationship helps the mentee navigate the obstacles and challenges they are likely to face in their job and personal life. With their own experiences in hand, the mentor can help prepare the mentee, leading them to see success. If you work with membership, it is time to mentor your replacement. Put together a checklist of things to cover, i.e., myLegion, recruiting, retention, revitalization, and how to find information.

First, I apologize for not submitting an Article for the Legion Link in December. I was at a loss to put into words the thoughts I was having regarding National Security. A strong National Defense is one of the Four Pillars upon which the Legion Stands. Maybe I am a worrier, but I see our Nation undergoing one of its most difficult periods, and I do not see that the pendulum is set to swing back to where it has been for several years.

1) The war here at home is becoming more and more serious. Power stations in North and South Carolina were sabotaged by gunfire causing power outages. Power is still out for some folks. While looking at these events, I noted that similar attacks had also occurred in Oregon and Washington State. Electric substations that control Gas and oil pipelines in California and South Dakota, causing supply issues with gas and oil, have also been attacked. Various manifestos and groups on Social Media platforms have been advocating for this. Is it from Americans? Who is responsible?

2) A strong National Defense is not only physical outside our borders but physical at and within our borders as well. We need to stop the illegal immigration of people into our country. I just watched the news two days ago that showed folks lining up to get into America in the thousands, a woman carrying her baby across a river was interviewed. All of this was in broad daylight. What we have in place for adjudication is not going to work. It has been a problem forever, but things are so bad in other countries that the numbers here are multiplying.

I worked on a Resolution this summer that was presented to Congress. It was the subject of one of my Legion Link notes. Immigration reform is the answer. The problem must be fixed if we are to survive as a country.

3) Speaking of Social Media, I find that Facebook has made communication with Legion Members much easier than years ago. News can be immediate and reach more folks in a timely matter. Questions can be asked, solutions provided. It is a good thing. But the problem with Facebook and other Social Media Platforms is that it allows us to step away from our internal filters that parents, teachers, religious groups and mentors have taught us we should maintain. Standards of Social behavior are being eroded.

I scroll along my timeline and see postings from friends or friends of friends of things that I would never say about another person or organization. You can throw it out there and get people to like it. That is all we are after right, recognition and admiration? But is it false? Do they really like it or are they just trying to start a social media war. Are these folks true friends and acquaintances or are they fake accounts and Chinese or Russian agents, or event domestic agents trying to bring down society? There is an awful lot of hurt speech going on out there. The truth is, I believe that every person should be treated the way that I would like to be treated.

People who break the law should be punished. We should all believe and act with the Four Pillars of the American Legion. We should all respect the flag. We should all pay taxes. We should all work and support

I have written all of my representatives about issues on behalf of myself and on behalf of the Legion.

We need to Vote when it is election time. We need to help and encourage others to Vote, likeminded or not. And we need to make sure that all American Citizens have the right to vote without interference or impediments.

If nothing else, I hope this article will encourage debate, foster ideas, or help you become more involved in our country's security and economy. Work your membership, attend your post meetings and remember to support the Four Pillars.

Our hearts and prayers continue to go out to the Veterans, their families, and all the communities affected by hurricane lan. Women Veterans are the fastest-growing population in the Veteran community.

However, as the number of women increases to serve our country, our nation needs to catch up in meeting their needs. In May 2022, a Fact-Finding Committee on Women **Veterans Benefits and Communications** was formed to assess the needs of Women Veterans in Florida. The committee wanted to ensure that the 164,000 women veterans in Florida knew about their benefits. As military experts shared with Congress

last year, many of our almost 2 million living women veterans struggle to transition back to civilian life due to unmet needs, including employment counseling, financial guidance, and health and mental health support. The Department of Veterans Affairs reports that veteran women are almost twice as likely as non-veteran women to experience homelessness.

We must do better for women who put everything aside to serve our country. This means providing transition and follow-up support to all.

As a female veteran, I know it can sometimes feel lonely in a world where no one understands what happened to you in the military. Also, it can be harder to connect with non-Veteran females. The American Legion Department of Florida has heard you. We are conducting District/Area wide Women Veteran Forums throughout Florida to ensure we listen to women veterans and understand their challenges. The forums are open to any female veteran; they do not have to belong to the American Legion.

# **DEC Meets in Regular Session**

A regular meeting of the Department Executive Committee (DEC), called by Department Commander Eunice Butts, was held at the Caribe Royale on Sunday, November 20, 2022, at 9:30 AM. Forty-Eight DEC members were present.

Decisions of the DEC, in the order in which they were discussed, included:

# 1. Ratification of New Posts

The temporary charter of Spring Hill Post 418 was ratified.

2. Post Charters to be Cancelled

Reports were heard on Tavares Post 76 and Coconut Creek Post 170. Both posts voluntarily turned in their charter, which the DEC voted to accept.

#### 3. Post Charters to be Discussed

Reports were heard on four Posts (59, 91, 131, and 114), which were tabled during the June DEC regular meeting to allow the District Commanders to continue to work with the posts and conduct revitalizations.

- The DEC voted to cancel Branford Post 59's charter due to not being at charter strength.
- The DEC voted to continue working with Trenton Post 91 and Greenville Post 131 revitalizations until the DEC meeting held during Department Convention in June.
- Post 114 is now above charter strength. Therefore, the DEC took no action.

### 4. Squadron Charters to be Cancelled

A motion passed to cancel the charters of Lake Wales Squadron 71, Zephyrhills Squadron 118, Key Biscayne Squadron 410, and Rockledge Squadron 374 due to having zero members for the past three years.

#### 5. Department Finance Report

The following finance report was given by Department Finance Officer Ken DeMello:

Department's Financials for the 2021-2022 fiscal year, ending June 30, 2022: The Profit & Loss statement shows a total income of \$3,734,422 and total expenses of \$3,618,389, giving Department a net income of \$5,644 when we were budgeted to have a deficit of \$46,713. The balance sheet statement shows total assets of \$4,048,388 and total liabilities of \$148,356.

Department's Financials for the first three months of the 2022-2023 fiscal year, as of September 30, 2022: The Profit & Loss statement shows a total income of \$1,358,640 and total expenses of \$1,192,454, giving Department a net income of \$166,185. The balance sheet statement shows total assets of \$4,196,095 and total liabilities of \$129,873.

Department's annual audit was performed from August through October of 2022 by MKA CPA's and Advisors. Reading directly from the audit opinion letter, it states, "In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, and the changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America."
