As we enter March, we look forward to The Legion's Birthday, St. Patrick's Day, and of course, the beginning of the Legislative Session. The session will begin on March 7th, run for 60 days, and be filled with

bills and budget requests.

What can you do? Beginning the week

of March 13th, stay tuned for the weekly update of the bills we are tracking and the stance that we are taking on these bills. It will come as a pdf document with a bill number, title, and a brief synopsis of the bill's purpose. Of course, to find more information about the bill, we encourage you to pull the bill up using either The Florida House of Representatives or The Florida Senate website and place the bill number in the bill search.

The March on Tallahassee will be on March 14th. This event is where we convene in

Tallahassee and meet with our Legislators about the bills we are tracking. Yes, it is early in the session, and this will aid us by either getting the bill calendared or testifying if it has been read. If you would like to know more about The March on Tallahassee, please go to our Department website, where we will post information as it becomes available.

For now, please know that we are busy looking into the bills being filed and analyzing these bills and how they affect our veterans and families.



The inspection team comes to the program/classrooms and conducts the inspections throughout the day. The cadets demonstrate that they truly have a "cadetrun program" in which they work tirelessly to make sure they get scores that exceed standards and earn Units of Distinction Awards and accolades. The attached photo is for Dillard AFJROTC FL791 for the

presentation of the Top Performer Ribbons for the "Rising Stars Award" by their Senior Instructor, MSgt. (Ret) T. Robinson and the AF Inspector, LtCol (Ret) Buck. Congratulations to all these outstanding cadets and others who will be reviewed during these inspections.

Last month, the Army JROTC State Marksmanship Competition was held at Island Coast High School in Cape Coral. There were 26 Teams and 106 individual competitors in a daylong event that went very smoothly. The 13th District Lee County event precedes it held on the previous day for local teams. The State Marksmanship match is conducted the following day by the Army 6th Brigade to determine the top teams within Florida. There we three separate firing sequences using 34 firing lanes. The host school sold refreshments and food, and many parents and family members were present. There were teams from across the state, with three schools

participating from Cape Coral for the State Meet. Mariner HS took first place in the District and State events. I want to give special thanks to American Legion Post 90, JROTC Chairman Dennis Stebbins, who has given so much time, money, and support to this event which has been a standing tribute to the Marksmanship Program throughout the past years. Attached is a photo of the Marksmanship Meet at Cape Coral for the Award Ceremony, which is in part sponsored by the Department of Florida.

Women Veterans Want To Be Seen Deanna Hall, Women Veterans womenvets@legionmail.org



"To the Women of our Nation's Armed Forces, Thank You!"—America

Since July, we have been meeting with multiple women veterans, exploring connections between

women's experiences while serving on active duty and their self-identification as veterans.

Despite the differences in rank, a branch of service, ethnicity, years in service, and age, the military women we spoke to all shared their desire to have their service recognized. They acknowledged that there are approximately 164,000 women veterans in the state of Florida, and they are constantly overlooked by their communities, including by institutions specifically created to support veterans. The gap in access can have tragic effects:

A recent report noted that women veterans' suicide has increased by 10%, and they are the fastest-growing homeless population in the United States. Several women we spoke with had experienced Military Sexual Trauma (MST), suicide attempts, and periods of homelessness after leaving the military.

Despite these mortifying statistics and experiences, most women veterans, including the women we spoke with, are thriving. These women veterans just want to be visible.

While in the military, most of these women were the only females in their units. They felt they were the only ones who had to endure sexual misconduct and retaliation if reported. They felt embarrassed about their service-connected female-related health conditions and did not want to make a big deal about it. DEPT COMMANDER NEEDS YOU - HELP HER FINISH STRONG

PROJECT: VetRelief continues to be in high demand, which means we are helping more and more of Florida's veterans each year.

When Hurricane Ian hit in September 2022, PROJECT: VetRelief was able to take action and provide necessary assistance to our service members in the form of Publix food cards. This support allowed veterans to keep the food on the table as they dealt with long power outages or even major damage to their homes.

However, the program has seen inflated support cases largely due to significant increases in shelter expenses to veterans who rent their home. At the present time, landlords can raise the monthly rent by any dollar amount. So far, we have seen jumps ranging anywhere between \$200-\$900 per month, of which Florida's veterans can't afford.

For these two reasons, **our financial burden has doubled this year.** The total number of approved cases in the first

6-months is already more than the entire number of veterans we supported all last year!

Thankfully, the Department Commander, Eunice Butts, has recognized the true impact of the emergency assistance program and chose to support these efforts as one of her charities of choice!

As she makes her rounds throughout the state, we hope that you will accept her challenge to the Legion Family to raise \$50,000 by the end of June. Help her finish her year strong, as she only needs \$16,270 more to reach her goal!
