Many of you, I'm sure, are wondering just what the current status is of the 6 Posts that sustained the most damage, where they stand today, and if they still need assistance. On the 6th of July, we were met by the Post Commander or designee at each of the Posts, and here are the results. The great photos courtesy of the one and only Edward "Snappy" Lewis.

#### Arcadia, Post K-11

We met with Commander Ron Jones at the Post and were very impressed with the progress. They had opened the Tiki Bar about two months earlier to help generate income. The interior of the main building is now open and has hosted several District Riders meetings. If you are familiar with this Post, it has been flooded a few times before, but never to this extent. They have taken steps to remedy the flooding issue by replacing the walls with waterproof insulation and metal sheeting, which can be removed to allow for drying out the interior. They are doing well and, under Commander Ron's guidance, will come back as strong as ever.

#### Port Charlotte, Post 110

We were greeted by incoming Commander Steve Copeland when we arrived at Post 110. Current Post Commander Jay Hemingway joined us to tour the up-and-coming, totally refurbished interior of the main building. The new roof has been completed for a while now, and ceilings and walls are currently being replaced. They have a goal of a soft opening on July 16th, which I believe is a bit aggressive, but I wish them luck. The Tiki Bar out back has been in operation since the hurricane, so technically, this Post never closed. With your help, they were able to feed hundreds of people daily thanks to all the volunteers at the Post. They will be back, stronger and better!

#### Post 192, Ft Myers

We were greeted by the new Commander, Craig Brock of Post 192. This family has come together so well after the devastation of Ian. The building now has a new roof, bathrooms, paint, and tile. It has been transformed thanks to the assistance of its members, local businesses, and people from around the State and country. A lot of the work has been done by Craig and his crew on a self-help basis. They are now open and welcome you to their Post.

#### Post 303, Bonita Springs

Rod Rodriguez of Post 303 met us at the Post and gave us a tour of the interior of the Post. He explained that the plans are in place, and they are just waiting on the permits to begin construction. According to Rod, they will rebuild, and it will be better than ever. They are looking at reopening around the end of the calendar year. Post 303 is currently working with the Bonita VFW, conducting their meetings and fundraisers.

#### Post 274, Ft Myers Beach

After Hurricane Ian destroyed Post 274 from the inside out, Commander Joe Bullock wasted no time getting his Post back in business. Utilizing self-help and Post funds and your donations, they initiated the clean-up in record time and began the rebuild. They completed the rebuild of the west side of the Post and were ready to open for business, but as luck would have it, red tape would delay the opening. But perseverance paid off, and they are now open. They offer a full bar and lunches every day.

#### Post 123, Sanibel

Commander John Hird of Post 123 has had a few hurdles to overcome through this whole ordeal, with very little money and even fewer volunteers. But he felt he had to do something. He communicated with the 13th District about cleaning up the Tiki and opening for the Road Race they have every year. When asked for volunteers to help, more than 30 Legion families from all over the 13th District showed up in the sweltering heat. And they got the Job done! They were open the following weekend. The building itself will be a challenge, but with the strength of District 13, they will get the job done.

The American Legion will not be obligated to comply with any actions with which The American Legion disagrees. This resolution will initially be implemented by the Marketing Commission and later become the responsibility of the VA&R Commission. Meanwhile, all commissions will cooperate to assist in preventing veteran suicide.

The 104th National Convention is this month in Charlotte, NC, August 25-31. If you are planning to attend, please remember that unless you are on stage during the general assembly, business casual is the uniform of the day. As usual, there are many events you can attend, including Color Guard and Post Band contests. Exhibit Hall and Emblem Sales, Charlotte Exhibit

Hall, will be open. And if you have plenty of time, the 96th American Legion World Series will be in Shelby, N.C., on August 10-15

Initial planning has started for the Department of Florida's Walk 4 America! This event is to be held between February 8th - 11th in 2024.

So I'm sure you are asking, "What is the Walk 4 America?" The purpose of this Walk 4 America

is a celebration of this ideal of Americanism, which is further defined in the opening to the Declaration of Independence that states, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." For some reason, Americanism has taken on a negative connotation to a portion of our communities. We need to turn that around. This event is designed to show how

veterans are leading that charge.

The month of February 2024 is designated as Americanism month. The "Walk 4 America" will start in Winter Garden, FL. and travel thru the five Florida Districts (17th. 5th. 3rd. 4th. and 6th Districts), two Florida Areas, and 17 Florida counties. After 12 days, ending on Presidents Day, we will have hoped to have visited 33 American Legion Posts and 3 Villages Squares while covering 675 total miles (including walking over 286 kilometers), averaging 24km/day (14.5miles/day) walking. But our Department Commander, Michael "Gambler" Raymond, is asking that all 272 Florida Posts find a way to celebrate Americanism during this period.

The visits to each Post will last about 1 hour. The goal is to have representatives from your community, including elected officials, your Boys State and Girl State delegates, Boy Scouts, JROTC/Sea Cadets, Legion baseball teams, oratorical contestants, school medal winners, Youth Law cadets, in attendance so that they can be recognized by the local

community and/or press. We also want you to invite any other local organizations (like the Elks, Rotary, VFW, DAV, Marine Corps League, Navy League, etc.) that want to help celebrate America as we can during this 12-day period, which will end on Presidents Day. Finally, Posts should coordinate and organize a Blood Drive with Blood One for that day, conduct flag retirements, and present flag grommets to Dept Chair. Basically, we want your Post to host a HUGE celebration of America and honor her in your own special way.

Greetings to all. I hope this finds all of you in good health. I first want to thank the incoming Commander Michael Raymond for giving me the opportunity to serve as your Department Disaster Preparedness Chairman for 2023-2024.

As you know the hurricane season begins on June 1 and ends on the 30 of November. Since June 1, we have had three tropical storms and one subtropical storm. The peak of hurricane is September 10 with most of the storms

occurring between August and October.

We had a migration of 444,500 people to Florida from 2021-2022, and in 2020 there were 185,000. That's not including undocumented individuals. So how many new people coming to Florida know what a hurricane is and how to prepare for one? I would guess not too many. That's why we as legionnaires need to educate our fellow legionnaires and the public and help them prepare.

I've been in contact with the Department Commander, and we will be setting up a seminar on hurricane preparedness. I would also like to set up a meeting on Facebook for all that are interested. This would be a good time to have one while the

season is still quiet.

I can prep you on what you need to do before, during, and after a storm, but you are the only one that can make the decision and the course you take.

We have no control of the outcome of a storm but if we prepare and listen to the directions given by the authorities we will be that much farther ahead of the game.

My name is Jim Burk, and I was recently appointed Homeless

For the past eight years, I have been involved in a mobile outreach to homeless and disadvantaged veterans. This involves going out into the woods on a weekly basis.

Florida's point-in-time count for this year indicates approximately 3000 homeless veterans in Florida. This number is not accurate. The count does not include day workers, people not in camp at the time the count takes place, or veterans that just won't cooperate. The count, while unknown, is nearer to 4000. Regardless of the total, we have an obligation to help our fellow veterans and attempt to get them the services they decayed

In the future, I will cover such topics as camp protocol, sources

for donations, community contacts, the HUD VASH voucher program for vets, community partners, and other topics. I can also provide a training program that can be presented at your district meetings.

This Month my Post (Post 80 St.
Cloud) was all abuzz about a new
Movie that recently appeared in
theatres called "Sound of Freedom."
Without giving it away, it is a
true story about rescuing children
who have been abducted for sex
trafficking. It brought me back

to my memory of a Police Officer taking a report on missing teenagers who were presumed runaways. We would take the information and photographs, enter it in FCIC/NCIC, and send it to a State Database of missing children. That is all that local Law Enforcement we're required to do. The thought that they may have been abducted as enslaved people never dawned on us. So, I did some research and thought this would be a good read for our Legion Family, remembering that one of our four Pillars is Children and Youth.

- There are 27.6 million trafficked persons globally today, and almost 20% are children. (U.S. State Department, United Nations)
- Approx 350,000 are reported missing every year in the U.S., and an estimated 100,000 are being trafficked. (NCMEC)
- Child Sex Trafficking has been reported in all 50 States. (NCMEC)

- The 2021 Federal Human Trafficking Report stated that 57% were minors.
- The United States is one of the top destinations for Human Trafficking and is one of the largest consumers of child sex.
- Human Trafficking is a \$150 billion-per-year business.
   (U.S. Department of Homeland Security)

Legion family watches the children and protects our children from this Evil System that most of us (including me, a retired Law Enforcement Officer). It is our duty.

There will be 15 competitors each for the Precision and the Sporter Category. Florida is honored to have a National Sporter Competitor, Nathan Krokstrom, from the State Florida Winning Team, Mariner AJROTC Unit. There are several Military programs in Florida, such as the Sarasota Military Academy, Entrepreneur Leadership Military Academy in Hollywood Hills, and Boyd Anderson, that have a 5-day week schedule along with after-school and weekend events. Remember, the younger Veterans want to volunteer and do things, so find out

their interests. Don't be afraid of change, as the "way we have always done things" doesn't apply anymore.

Please use all the tools(suggestions) that should have been given to you to work the mission. I will be monitoring the numbers for Posts that may be having issues. If you have a problem, need assistance, have a question, need training, etc., please use your chain of command. District membership chair, Area membership chair, and then myself. I ask that you please do not call Department directly (Bruce Comer or Joann Collins). They have enough on their plate already, and with the team we have, we should be able to take care of anything that comes up.

There are many membership awards available for you to earn, and I want to give away as many as possible. Many of these awards are already available to earn at Fall Conference. I look forward to working with everyone this year. We should "Be the One" to prevent suicide and "Be the One" for membership. Let's work together to get Florida back to the top at National. I have no doubt we will meet or beat our Department Commanders' challenge.

to thank Gambler for having the
confidence in me to take on this
job. National Security is one of the
4 Pillars of the American Legion.
In much of the literature of the

Legion, it is the second Pillar, behind Veterans and ahead of Americanism and Children and Youth. There are many programs under the National Security "Banner." The American Legion has taken numerous positions on national defense, homeland security, border and immigration control, and military support with one goal: "The key to peace and world stability is a strong, well-resourced solid defense.

Examples of these Banners are Blood Donor Programs, ROTC Medals and scholarship Programs, Crime Prevention and Law and Order Programs like police officer, firefighter, EMT of the year, the Blue Star Banner, and Gold Star banner programs. There are also programs for Funeral Honors, Honor Guard, and Operation Comfort Warriors. Many of the Legion Family entities also participate in support of active duty military members by means of Adopting Military Units, sending care packages, providing emotional and communication assistance for dependents and families of deployed military members, and fundraisers for the purchase of calling cards for use in front line units. Veteran Service Officers and VA volunteers assist our injured veterans upon their return and the helping of families deal with recovery and rehabilitation efforts and procedures with their veterans who have returned home with injuries.

Lastly, and I mention these items because we live in Florida, Disaster Preparedness is a big part of looking after our legion family members and the family of everyone deployed from Florida and supporting our communities. This year Gambler has two charities he is hoping to raise funds for Disaster Relief and Children's Organ Transplant Association. We have been reactionary the past few years with the hurricanes and major storms in Florida and neighboring states. We need to be preemptive and have the funds and supplies on hand to have a better response time for these events. There are still several (5, I think) posts in South Florida that have been closed due to damage or destruction. COTA provides support and expenses for families with Children waiting for Organ Transplants. Parents need to worry about and care for their children without worrying about bills, travel costs, hotels, etc. This is a fantastic program and has been a Commander's Charity several times over the last ten or 15 years.

Here is what I am hoping for from this year. I did not get it completed last year, but I have developed an Award for Security

Let me introduce myself; I am Denton "Denny" Luke from Dewitt B. Tilden Post 316, Atlantic Beach, FL. First, I would like to thank Commander Michael Raymond for giving me the privilege of serving you as your 2023-2024 Department of Florida POW-MIA Chairman. I will strive to keep you updated on the status of any POWs, MIAs, the National POW-MIA Memorial and Museum being built in Jacksonville, and any known POW-MIA events. As of the end of June, over 81,000 DoD personnel are still unaccounted for. For FY 2023, the DPAA has identified 57 personnel from WW II, 28 from the Korea war, and three from the Vietnam War.

#### **Resolution Instructions**

Any Legionnaire can impact the priorities and positions of The American Legion at any level because the organization's focus is primarily directed by resolutions. A resolution is a position-driven initiative written by members and put to a vote. They can be passed at any level, starting at

the Post level, and can impact any level of the organization. The optimal time to write a resolution is in the winter and spring, ahead of department conventions in late spring and summer. If you plan to submit a resolution, please start early and stay in contact with me so that we can work to get a good document.

Resolutions are relatively easy to write but require a lot of attention to detail. The resolutions submitted at our last convention lacked attention to detail. There were problems with poor grammar, poor punctuation, misspelled words, and multiple topics in one resolution. The rules are simple, but they must be followed.

When writing a resolution, some general considerations should be kept in mind:

- A resolution should contain "supporting documents," and its intent should be clearly defined.
- 2. A resolution should be free of errors of fact and law.
- 3. A resolution should have material relevance to the purposes and programs of The American Legion.

A resolution should deal with only one topic. Those that address more than one topic make it hard to process, especially if they involve topics that fall under the jurisdiction of more than one committee. They may either be rejected or amended to eliminate all but one topic. Thus topics you may have wanted to be addressed have to wait another year.

Resolutions have two major parts, a **preamble**, and a **resolving section**. Each consists of one or more clauses, and the whole is read in its entirety, beginning with the preamble, as one continuous complex sentence. The preamble sets forth the reasons for the resolution; the resolving section sets forth the intent of the resolution.

I will describe resolution writing in detail in future months, beginning with the resolving section, as it should be written first

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#### **DEC MEETS IN REGULAR SESSION**

A regular meeting of the Department Executive Committee (DEC), called by Department Commander Eunice Butts, was held at the Hilton Orlando Lake Buena Vista on Thursday, June 15, 2023, at 2:40 PM. Fifty DEC members were present.

The following is a brief meeting summary that highlights the major items discussed and decisions of the DEC, in the order in which they were discussed:

#### 1. Rafflebox

Department Adjutant Bruce E. Comer presented a new online 50/50 Raffle fundraising campaign.

#### 2. Post Charters not at Charter Strength

- Graceville Post 42 The DEC voted to place the post on probation pending a revitalization.
- Bonifay Post 44 The DEC voted to give the post until Fall Conference and provide an update.
- Davie Post 223 The post voluntarily turned in its charter and merged with Posts 321 and 365, which the DEC voted to accept.
- West Hollywood Post 308 No action was taken as the District Commander will work to revitalize the post (editor's notes: within one week of the convention, their membership was submitted and was above charter strength).
- Punta Gorda Post 405 The DEC voted to allow the District to continue working with the post.

#### 3. Post Charters Discussed

- Branford Post 59 The DEC voted to cancel Post 59's charter at the DEC meeting held during the 2022 Fall Conference due to being below charter strength. However, since the Post is now above charter strength, at 153%, The DEC motioned to rescind their previous decision to cancel the charter.
- Greenville Post 131 The DEC voted to table until Fall Conference to conduct a revitalization.

#### 4. Squadron Charters Discussed

- Ft. Myers Squadron 192 The DEC voted to table until Fall Conference to give the Post and Detachment the ability to elevate their membership to charter strength.
- Wellington Squadron 390 The DEC voted to cancel their charter due to inactivity and not being at charter strength.

#### 5. SAL Resolution

Detachment Judge Advocate Jim Roberts presented Detachment of Florida's Resolution 23-01, titled Bestow upon James Sheubrooks the title of Past National Commander with all the privileges and rights pertaining to such office. The DEC voted to support this Resolution.

#### 6. Department Finance Committee Report

- A report on the Department's financials as of March 31, 2023, and the Department's investments, was given by Department Finance Officer Ken DeMello. The Department's Profit & Loss statement shows a total income of \$3,084,830 and total expenses of \$2,649,626 for a net income of \$435,204.
- Department Finance Chair Larry White reported on the Department's fundraising and membership income.
- National Investigation In 2021, three posts submitted resolutions to National, alleging wrongdoing within the Department of Florida. The Posts, when interviewed by National, had little to no knowledge of the issues to which they made the allegations, and one of the posts stated they had knowledge but took issue with other decisions made by Department in the past. All three posts agree that the resolutions were written by someone else and given to them to pass at their post. As a result of the investigation, the Department received a preliminary bill from National for ~\$15,000. The DEC voted to pay the bill when the detailed invoice was sent, and a second motion was made to split the actual cost three ways and send a bill to each of the three posts asking them to reimburse the Department. Both motions were voted on and passed.
- The DEC approved the proposed 2023-2024 Budget with an asterisk until Resolution 23-7, Insurance Marketing Distributions, passes or not, as it would affect the 2023-2024 Budget. The budgeted total income is \$3,511,267, and the total budgeted expenses are \$3,584,200, with a deficit of \$72,933 (editor's note: Resolution 23-7 did not pass).

#### 7. Detachment 2023-2024 Budget

The DEC approved the 2023-2024 Detachment Budget presented by Detachment Finance Committee Chair Ed Sheubrooks. The budgeted total income is \$246,000, and the total budgeted expenses are \$246,000.

#### 8. Department ALR 2023-2024 Budget Approval

The DEC approved the 2023-2024 ALR Budget that Department ALR Chair Jim Wineland presented. The budgeted total income is \$215,600, and the total budgeted expenses are \$15,900. The total net income before donations is \$199,700.

#### 9. Florida Motorcycle Safety Program Contract

ALR Chair Jim Wineland presented the Florida Motorcycle Safety Program Contract. The DEC voted to table to review the program and the National American Legion's stance on joining outside organizations.

#### DEC MEETS IN REGULAR SESSION

A regular Department Executive Committee (DEC) meeting was held on Sunday, June 18, 2023, at 9:28 AM at the Hilton Orlando Lake Buena as required per Article VII, Section 10 of the Department's Constitution. Department Commander Michael "Gambler" Raymond conducted the meeting. Fifty-one DEC members were present.

The following is a brief meeting summary that highlights the major items discussed and decisions of the DEC, in the order in which they were discussed:

#### 1. Department Commander's Appointments

Commander Raymond announced the following appointments for the ensuing year: Finance Officer Shirley Douglas; Judge Advocate David Pleasanton; Assistant Judge Advocate Gene Smith; Membership Chair Bruce Carl; Finance Committee 5-year appointment Kurt Gies; and Finance Committee Chair Larry White; Time & Place 5-year appointment, Paul Martel; Children & Youth Fund Committee 3-year appointment, Eunice Butts; and Religious Emphasis Committee 3-year appointment, Willie Branch, Jr., which were ratified. The DEC also approved Commander Raymond to make necessary appointments throughout his term.

Jim Carlin was elected 17th District Commander during the 17th District Constitutional Conference but resigned. Per Article IX, Section 3 of the Department Constitution, Commander Raymond appointed Jim Bowers as the 17th District Commander. Since Jim Bowers was elected the 17th District's First Vice commander, this appointment creates a vacancy for that elected position. Therefore, Commander Raymond appointed Bryant Thorpe, who was elected to be the District's Second Vice Commander, to serve as the First Vice Commander. Both appointments were ratified.

#### 2. Department Adjutant's Briefing

Adjutant Bruce E. Comer gave a brief overview of the following topics:

- All Department Officers, Area Commanders, District Commanders, and District Vice Commanders must provide their DD214 to the Department along with a current Distinguished Legionnaire Form.
- Accidental Death Insurance and Dismemberment Insurance are provided by the Department for all Department Officers if the incident occurs while conducting Legion business.
- Role as Department Officers, Area Commanders, and District Officers.
- Expense Reports and Monthly Activity Reports.
- Important dates for the upcoming year:

  - o National Membership Workshop July 28-29, 2023
  - o 104<sup>th</sup> National Convention August 25-31, 2023
  - o Department Fall Conference November 17-19, 2023
