Greetings, fellow Legionnaires; I hope everyone had a great holiday season. I'm not trying to be politically correct here; it's just that too many groups celebrate a holiday at this time of the year to

mention them all.

Keeping up with the training that I have been providing on this forum. As you may have noticed, I have been big on the protocol at meetings and other activities and ceremonies. Our organization has been based on protocol since its inception in 1919. I encourage everyone to go to the Department website and download the "Sergeant-at-Arms and Protocol Manual" from the resources section. There is a lot of good information there, from how to set up your meeting or ceremonial room to when to wear your Legion Cap and how to introduce fellow Legionnaires in your meeting or ceremony. This manual should be followed as closely as possible at your Post or District.

I have been asked what size flag should be on outdoor flag poles. Even though you can get this Special National Executive Committee Meeting, The American Legion voted to send a strong message to Congress, Resolution 1, indicating we oppose any legislation that seeks to elevate the standing of predatory claims companies by legitimizing practices that target Veterans and their dependents, and urged the Department of Veterans Affairs Office of Inspector General and Office of General Counsel to work more effectively with the Federal Trade

For our ALR members who display a U.S. Flag on their motorcycles, I am sure you know that there is a right way and wrong way to display your flags. If you are only displaying the U.S. Flag, the flag should be in the center rear of the motorcycle. If you are displaying multiple flags, the U.S. Flag should be in the center and noticeably higher than the other Commission, Department of Justice, state attorneys general and state bar associations to identify and prosecute such predatory claims companies to the fullest extent of the law. This resolution supports the "Guard Act" currently moving through Congress.

flags. If it is not noticeably higher, it should be on the right (curbside) of the motorcycle. This is because when your motorcycle is resting on its



kickstand, it will be higher than the other flags. If you are placing two or more flags on stands on a car or truck, you should place all flags at the same height with the U.S. Flag on the passenger side of the vehicle, so when looking at the vehicle from the front, the U.S. Flag will be on the left side, just as you display your flags in your meetings.

I have also been asked about placing a Bible on the POW/MIA Table. This is optional. Although this is optional, the reading of the meaning of what is on the table, most places I have looked up, does not include the Bible.



year's dues. This places them into the national database, and part of that identifies and designates them to the state they reside in. For Florida, this is Post 400, our holding Post for these new members in TAL. Along with this process, it also shows how long they are in that DMS program, to which, if they have only been there for one or two years, they are assigned a special Alpha code of "AD." This AD code is unique because it allows these particular members to count toward the National's goal set for the year even if they paid their dues, a mulligan. These DMS members are transferred one of two ways: if they are "Paying your Post" while their current membership is in good standing, you can utilize the MyLegion through your Posts portal. If they have already paid their dues, you will have to transfer them using an MDF (Member Data Form) and send it to the Department to be processed.

But how do I find these Gems? And how do I identify which ones are within my

Post's proximity vs another Post?

In some areas, that can be challenging, like the St. Petersburg area, where you can almost see one Post from the other (very close to each other). In this type of situation, a gentleman's agreement should be observed. But for the most part, there are identifiable demarcations between Posts, and respecting other Posts' zones should be observed. The best method is by zip codes because it usually gives the demarcation lines. Once these zip codes (or parts of zip codes) are recognized, you can start your quest to find these gems (new members).

To access these members, go to MyLegion.org and log in; once there, you can access them by "Find a member in my Area." If your Post has more than one zip code, make each listing one zip code at a time; it helps limit the area and size of each list. Another is by proximity (distance in miles), but that can bleed into other Post areas. Once you establish these listings, you can request these Post 400s for your Post. One of the easiest ways

is through emailing them (if they have an email address), several at a time by pasting their email address into the BCC (Blind Carbon Copy) location, with an attached transfer letter about your Post and what your Post is doing in their community with the Veterans and Youth. A snail mail letter is another option, but it is more time-consuming and costly. It is, in some cases, the only option. Your Post could also get a few members at your Post and call these potential new members. This would be the same Team that does Buddy Check calls the "Be the One" program.

But what about Post to Post transfers?

If the member is unknown, especially an out-ofstate member, it might be prudent to gather some background about them by the Post they are leaving. Remember, once you accept a Veteran/member into your Post, they are there until they want to leave or a trial. So, due diligence is advised when accepting members into your Post. Once the Post is satisfied and the member is willing to be transferred, use an MDF (Member Data Form) to complete it. If they are now current with their membership and are ready

Month. The "Celebration of America – A Walk 4 America" will start in Winter Garden, FL, and travel through the five Florida Districts (17th, 5th, 3rd, 4th, and 6th Districts), two Florida Areas, and 17 Florida counties. After 12 days, ending on Presidents Day, we will have hoped to have visited 33 American Legion Posts and 3 Villages Squares while covering 675 total miles (including walking over 286 kilometers), averaging 24km/day (14.5miles/ day) walking. But our Department Commander, Michael "Gambler" Raymond, is asking that all 282 Florida Posts find a way to celebrate Americanism during this period. to pay next year's dues, you could transfer them to the MyLegion.org website. But only members eligible to pay can use the MyLegion processing website; anyone who does not will have to use an MDF and send it to the Department for processing.

Whether you are accessing by the DMS method or transferring from one Post to another, you should be respectful of other Posts. That includes transferring to an adjacent Post and contacting members from your last Post to come to the new one you are now at. You might find yourselves in hot water for attaining either another Post roster or your last Post roster and soliciting members to your new Post. This is not only unprofessional but disrespectful, as we are here to serve our Veterans, community, state, and nation. When personalities are energized, and spite pops its head up, it only leads to strife; we are better than that. Working together and not against ourselves is the pleasantness and continuity to harbor goodwill to all.

The visits to each Post will last about 1 hour. The goal is to have representatives from your community, including elected officials, your Boys State and Girl State delegates, Boy Scouts, JROTC/Sea Cadets, Legion Baseball Teams, Oratorical Contestants, School Medal Winners, Youth Law Cadets, in attendance so they can be recognized by the local community and/or press. We also want you to invite any other local organizations (like the Elks, Rotary, VFW, DAV, Marine Corps League, Navy League, etc.) that want to help celebrate America as we can during this 12-day period, which will end on Presidents Day. Finally, Posts should coordinate and

I hope everyone enjoyed their holidays with family and friends! Here comes the New Year, and we are looking for some new ideas; please share.

We have changed a few things at the Summit this year. Beverly will have a two-hour session on reporting and a couple of new ideas we must cover as required by "The Motorcycle Safety Association."

We will also offer a Red Cross CPR & First Aid course. The course is a little pricey, but as we all know, you get what you pay for. It includes CPR, AED, first aid, head, neck, muscle, bone, joint injuries, and splinting skills. It's a Five (5) hour course, with a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 24 individuals. There will be a charge of 45 dollars per person to attend to help cover the \$90.95 per person cost of the courses. After the course, you will receive a 2-year Certificate covering <u>Adult First</u> day, conduct flag retirements, and present flag grommets to the Department chair. Basically, we

<u>Aid/CPR/AED and Head, Neck, Muscle, Bone,</u> <u>Joint Injuries and Splinting. The cut-off date for</u> <u>registering for the program is January 19th</u>.

The Motorcycle Safety Association is starting to pick up speed. Remember, we are starting from scratch. We are designing a logo, educational material to be shared at events, a website, deliverables (pens, key chains, etc.), and an advertising campaign to support Motorcycle Safety. Your ALR team consists of myself, Connie Koonce, Assistant Program Manager, Ted Wieder, Safety/Road Captain, Lamar Camacho, website design, Shirley Douglas & Elizabeth Zuehlke, Finance. This will all be funded by a \$2.50 assessment at motorcycle registration, with no cost to the Department. We will need help from each Chapter/District in forecasting events, distributing motorcycle safety information at your events, and participating. More to come at the Summit.

All the scheduled activities are coming together, and at this point, we are on schedule.

Please ensure your canteen staff is checking for the 2024 cards before serving anyone. As they are the member's (or prospective members') first point of contact, they should also know how to take applications or renewals in the absence of a Post officer.

The 2023 cards have expired, and we need to get those remaining non-renewed members back into the Posts. Here is a sample letter you can use to contact those unrenewed members. Feel free to adapt it to your specific Post needs. Be sure to include events and functions you do at your Post, as well as community events you participate in and Legion programs that you work:

Good afternoon, Comrade,

I hope this email finds you in good health. The reason for this email is two-fold. One is to make sure you are doing okay and to see if there is anything the Post can do for you. We understand many members do not come to the Post, so it is difficult for us to know your situation. If you are struggling, please know that the Post is here for you and will try to assist you as best we can. Just give us a call!

The second reason is that in going through the Post roster, I noticed you have not renewed your membership for 2024. The end of the year has passed, and your 2023 card is no longer valid. You will lose all privileges at American Legion Posts around the world, including the canteen, games, and any other events that the Posts may be having. You will also lose all the other benefits that are available to you as a Legion member.

Your renewal is very important to both the Post and the Department of Florida. When you renew your membership, it helps the Post with activities and projects that support our Children and Youth, Veterans, and the local community here in Brooksville. Every year, our National Commander makes a report to Congress (since we were chartered by them). This report is a comprehensive overview of how many dollars, volunteer hours, programs, etc., the Legion donates to our programs. This is because they chartered us and can take us away if we are not performing up to their standards. We are the largest Veterans' organization in the world, and we set high standards for ourselves. We still follow the four Pillars that were originally set forth by our founders in 1919. Let your voice as a Veteran be heard! Please consider renewing your membership by going online, mailing it to the Post, or dropping it off at the Post. If there is anything we can do for you, please let us know!

Thank you for your service and for being a member of the American Legion.

It is time to start working on Phase 3 of the membership plan. Continue working on your renewals and DMS lists, which were Phases 1 and 2. In addition, now is the time to work on new members. The biggest part of Phase Three is meant for those Posts that are close to but have not hit 100% yet. If your Post needs 10 members or less to hit 100%, bring up a motion at your general

Disposal of Unserviceable Flags Ceremony: Cub Scouts from Pack 1381 (chartered to American Legion Post 138

in Port Tampa City) and Pack 9 (chartered to American Legion Post 147 in Odessa) conducted an Unserviceable US Flag Retirement Ceremony during a recent camping trip on MacDill AFB in Tampa. Per Title 4 of the US Flag code, section k, "The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be



destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning." Sons of the American Legion Squadron, 138 of Port Tampa City, purchased a dedicated fire pit for the purpose of retiring these flags. Contact me for more information on adding one of these customizable and collapsible fire pits to your gear locker (I don't get a commission). It is reasonably priced at about \$275, including the shipping.

Guidelines for the American Legion Square Knot Award: This BSA Community Organization Award was adopted by The American Legion to recognize members of the Legion family (TAL, SAL & ALA), who are also registered Scouters, and who have furthered Scouting and its relationship with the Legion. It is awarded to those Legion Scouters who have demonstrated their commitment to personal improvement and performance in the Legion Scouting program. ELIGIBILITY: Any member of the TAL, SAL, or ALA who completes the requirements while also registered as a Scouter in the BSA may apply for the award. Requirements that are completed while the applicant is neither a Legion family member nor a registered Scouter will not be considered. Note that not all the requirements have to be completed. Because of the multitude of Scouting positions, the applicant may select those optional requirements most suited to their involvement. This is not suitable for, nor should applications be submitted by Posts as a "congratulatory," "honorary," or "retirement" award. Scouters awarded the American Legion Square Knot Award, and thus eligible to wear the BSA Community Organization Knot on the BSA Field Uniform, may place a 3/8inch American Legion Lapel Tack in the center of the knot (Item Number 715.100).
