- 1. Chapters **MUST** have their own Plaque and in their possession to play the game. (example: If another chapter has your plaque, you may NOT capture another chapter's until you retrieve your own)
- 2. Chapters **Must** have a minimum of 5 ALR Members to retrieve or capture the Plaque. Riders are not required to be on a motorcycle to participate in the game.
- 3. The Plaque may not be hidden from potential captures
- 4. Plaque must be protected while in transit to avoid abrasions
- 5. There is no limit as to how many plaques can be captured in a single day
- 6. Once a Chapter retrieves their Plaque from the Captor, Your Plaque is safe from your Captor for 24 hours...BUT can be taken from another Chapter!
- 7. You may not retrieve YOUR plaque and take the capturing Chapter's plaque on the same day
- 8. You Must leave some type of notification that Your Chapter has Captured their Plaque. Example:



CPR/Addendum details (Miles & Donations) must be submitted to your Post Adjutant by May 1, 2024.





CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS

WHAT IS CYBERSECURITY

Cybersecurity focuses on protecting computers, networks, and information from unauthorized access or attack. Essentially, if a device connects to the Internet, it is vulnerable to attacks and needs protecting. Creating awareness regarding the threats are important in this digital age.

How do you use the Internet?

- What are your main concerns about using the Internet?
- Have you ever had your identity stolen?
 Do you have antivirus software on your computer and update it on a regular basis?

Many scammers target Americans ages 55 and older via emails and websites for charitable donations, online dating services, online auctions, buyer's clubs, health insurance, prescription medications, and health care.

At home, at work, and in the community, our growing use of technology, coupled with increasing cyber threats and risks to our privacy, demands greater security in our online world.



IDENTITY THEFT

Identity theft is the illegal use of someone else's personal information in order to obtain money or credit.

Tips

- Don't use the same password twice.
- Choose a password that means something to you and you only; use strong passwords with eight characters or more that uses a combination of numbers, letters, and symbols.
- Do not reveal personally identifiable information online such as your full name, telephone number, address, social security number, insurance policy number, credit card information, or doctor's name.
- Avoid opening attachments, clicking on links, or responding to email messages from unknown senders or companies that ask for your personal information.
- When making online donations, make sure any charity you donate to is a legitimate nonprofit organization and that you type in the web address instead of following a link.

- Be sure to shred bank and credit card statements before throwing them in the trash; talk to your bank about using passwords and photo identification on credit cards and bank accounts.
- Check your bank and credit card statements monthly for unusual charges.



FRAUD & PHISHING

Fraud is the intentional perversion of truth in order to induce another to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right.

Phishing is a scam by which an email user is duped into revealing personal or confidential information that the scammer can use illicitly or fraudulently.


Tips

- Most organizations banks, companies, etc. don't ask for your personal information over email.
 Beware of requests to update or confirm your personal information.
- Do not open attachments, click links, or respond to email messages from unknown senders
- Don't access your personal or banking accounts online from a public computer or kiosk.
- Beware of "free" prizes; if you think an offer is too good to be true, then it probably is.
- Make sure you change your passwords often and avoid using the same password for multiple accounts.
- Install and regularly update software firewall, antivirus, and anti-spyware programs. These
 programs can help to protect the data on your computer.




Facebook Events

Creating Events

- Events created in the Group are easy to set up
- Provides detailed info about the event
- Flyer is used as the main picture- can print or email
- Provides a sequential order of events for that group
- Events can be shared between groups
- Corrections and updates are instant
- Can show an expected number of participants
- Allows for discussion within the event page
- The event is just as important as setting it up!

EVENT CREATION

- Once you click 'Create Event', the basic information page comes up:
 - 1. <u>Photos/Video</u> This is where a DIGITAL copy of the flyer should be used, allowing anyone to print, download and distribute it.
 - 2. <u>Event Name</u> Enter as it appears on the flyer.
 - 3. <u>Start Date and Time Add End Time</u>
 - If it repeats, you can enter that here
 - 4. <u>Is it in person or virtual -</u> Enter the Address of the event! (*Important!*) This will create a map link on the event page.
 - 5. <u>Who can see it?</u> Populates from your group automatically
 - 6. <u>Invite all group members (tick box)</u>– Sends invite once complete.
 - 7. <u>What are the details?</u> This is where to enter as much information about the event as needed. This helps in case a change needs to be made, edit it here, and wherever it was shared it will be updated as well. One time operation!
