




The Historian Competition

Here are some of the things you need to keep in mind.



Do you know where to find the history book guidelines?



Check for most current version or at www.legion.org



Be Creative

The Judges have optional points that they can award for items that are especially attractive or useful.



Make sure pictures are clear



Crop Pictures

 Avoid Beverages or Cigarettes

• Don't paste too close to center of book.



Use the K.I.S.S theory

- Don't distract the viewer
 - Only three or four photos per event (recommended)
 - Leave Napkins and Matchbooks out
- You can add the "Fluff" back into your book when it's returned from competition.

- Name and Number of Post
- Volume Number if needed

Not to exceed three (3) inches between front and

back cover

Use Spacers to make both sides of book same thickness

 Located in lower left corner

- Neatly typed
- Centered



- Centered on Page
- Double spaced or more

- How Post name was selected
- Brief resume of the community
- Post Home information






Table of Contents (5)

- Separate units
 covering programs
 with page references
- If more than one volume, each volume should have a complete table of

content












Index (10)

Alphabetical index of

- Names
- Places
- Events
- This is at the end of the book
- If more than one volume, each volume should have a complete index





Page Numbering (5)

- Start with Title Page
- Be consistent
 - In location
 - Top or Bottom
- Count all pages even if they are blank
- Blank pages should state "Page intentionally left blank"

Clear Cut Photo (10)

- Clear and Sharp
- Blurry or Fuzzy will distract
- Proper arrangement





PART 3 – Judges Option/Originality 10 Points

Originality (10)

- Different in Thought
- Different in Presentation





PART 3 Judges Option/Originality - 10 Points cont.

• Items not readily cataloged under other headings

Features that make the book more useful

• Inaccuracies will have a disqualifying effect



Scoring

- If an item is in the book, you can not give the book a zero (0) for that item
- Except, judges points start at zero

- Narrative not statistical style
- Pleasing to general reader
- Write in third person
- Chronological / detailed account
- No analysis or interpretation

 - Who (use full proper name)
 - What
 - Where
 - When

- Check for relation to text
